It has always amused me when I see people looking at their reflections in shop windows. Just checking that all is presentable. I have been even more amused to find myself doing it from time to time!



Sky Guide for September 2024

The highlight of this month will be a partial eclipse of the full moon on the 18th. The eclipse will begin at 01:42 from our location and end at 05:48, from first to last contact with the penumbra.

The penumbra is where some sunlight is passing through the Earth's atmosphere and causes the moon to turn redder. The first and last contact with the umbra, where all light from the sun is blocked and the moon only reflects light from the earth, are at 03:14 and 04:16. The greatest part of the eclipse, where some 8% of the moon's disc will be covered, will be at 03:45. The moon will be in the south-west at some 24° from the horizon during the eclipse. New Moon will be on the 3rd with crescents visible either side of this date and also on the 30th. Please be careful if attempting to view the crescents using any optical aids if the sun is above the horizon. The moon will be close to Jupiter on the 23rd and then to Mars on the 25th. The Planets this month:

Mercury will be just visible but very low down, at around 10° above the horizon, from about the 6th to the 15th just before dawn and fade into the morning twilight.

Venus will not be visible from our location this month.

Mars will rise in the late evenings and climb to about 47° during the night and fade into the dawn at the start of the month. It will climb higher during the month to reach around 58° by month's end before fading. Jupiter will rise in the late evenings during the month and climb to around 54° in the south-east at the start and gradually reach 60° in the south by month's end before fading.

Saturn will rise in the south-east and set in the south-west during the month reaching a height of around 29° in the south about midnight all month.

Uranus will rise in the late evenings and climb to a height of some 56° in the south and fade into the dawn all month.

Neptune will rise in the late evenings in the south-east, reach a height of some 35° about 01:00 in the south and set in the south-west before dawn.

The Autumn Equinox will be on the 22nd, where day and night will be equal. This is a good time to spend some time outside looking at the night sky before the nights start to get cold. If you have binoculars the milky way will be visible running from the south to north.

Readings and Prayers Sunday September 1st 2

New Testament Passage: James 1. 17 – end

Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfilment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls.

But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing. If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the

Gospel Passage: Mark 7. 1-8; 14-15; 21-23

Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles. So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?' He said to them, 'Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

"This people honours me with their lips,

but their hearts are far from me

in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines."

You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition.' Then he called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.'

For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly.

All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person.

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence
