### Theres always further one can go!

I once had a little booklet published by Grove Books (1998). It was some reflections and learning from working with Faith and Light Communities in Nottinghamshire and South Yorkshire. These were Christian communities for people with learning disabilities and their friends and carers. This weeks Gospel focussing on the Good Samaritan reminded me of those days. I well remember us all bandaging one another's imagined wounds. There were all sorts of variations on how to bandage heads, arms, legs and chests! It was a really beautiful acting out of the care the Samaritan man had shown, and the care we were showing each other.

The parable continues to be one of the most well known of Jesus' stories. The need to show love and care to those who are struggling is still, self-evidently, a very good thing. And yet this lovely parable also had a very hard edge to it. Those listening to Jesus hated those Samaritans from 'up North'. The inhabitants of Judea in the south could simply not tolerate them, and the feeling was mutual. Feelings of animosity between peoples of the Middle East is certainly not a new development.

The parables are timeless, as is the way with moral stories. Jesus method of teaching was to encourage people to reach beyond themselves. In this case,

yes it is good to offer support to one another. Yes it is good to offer support to those in need. And yes at times, as in the case of the Samaritan, it is even better to lay aside ones prejudices. And to offer a helping hand to someone we would not normally have the chance to pass the time of day with. That is the way Jesus lived his life, and so the story teller certainly practised what he preached. Who knows, the time may come when we need to emulate



the time may come when we need to emulate him!
