faith. It launches its latest report at an open meeting held at Westminster every January. Earlier this year 105 MP's attended that event which is encouraging. Much of the work done to protect those at risk can happen at governmental level.

So our prayers and thoughts this week are a well-balanced affair. Thankfully as we remember those, who we loved, and have gone ahead of us. Those the New Testament writers describe as saints (small 's'). Celebratory for the heroic Saints (with a capital 'S'). And alongside these we humbly plead with the Almighty for the living saints. Praying that in the Holy Spirit God might stand alongside any who refuse to deny what they cherish when others threaten.
